With the memorial firmly in place, we now shift our efforts to raising funds for The Sgt. Alfred B. Hilton Memorial Scholarship, which we hope to be able to award perpetually. Last year, we awarded four \$1,000 scholarships to deserving Harford Community College students and hope to continue this tradition. Additionally, we are beginning our U.S.C.T. Grave Preservation Project which aims to identify the final resting places of Harford County related U.S.C.T. Thus far, we have identified approximately 90 soldiers and research is continuing to locate their graves and appropriately mark those locations. Finally, we are continuing our efforts to educate the public and hope to engage our students in Harford County Schools in continuing the study and research that has already begun. Your support and attendance here tonight will greatly aid us in reaching these goals.

Again, we sincerely thank you for joining us tonight and ask for your continued support in helping us fully realize our mission of honoring our Great American Hero!

Wistar "Star" Hardison

Chief, Cyber Workforce Governance

Department of Defense, Chief Information Office

Wistar "Star" Hardison is the Chief of the Cyber Workforce Governance Branch for the Department of Defense (DoD) Chief Information Office, where she works to attract, retain, and develop cyber warriors for the DoD. In her current position, Ms. Hardison is responsible for identifying new talent, shaping policy, and implementing strategies to build a more effective and resilient cyber workforce.

Born and raised in West Chester, Pennsylvania, Ms. Hardison has dedicated her life to serving the United States of America. She began this journey after graduating from Villanova University with a bachelor's degree in economics and earning her



commission via the Naval Reserve Officer Training Corps (NROTC). She was the first African American commissioned through Villanova's NROTC program and a Secretary of the Navy Distinguished Graduate. Ms. Hardison retired as Captain after 26 years of Naval Service.

During her military career, Ms. Hardison served as a Human Resources Officer, with assignments that took her across the world, including McMurdo Station in Antarctica, where she was the third African American Naval Officer to serve on the continent (and 2nd female African American Naval Officer), and Camp Lemonnier in Djibouti, Africa. Her last duty station was in Arlington, Virginia.

After retiring from the Navy, Ms. Hardison continued to provide Human Resource consultancy services to the DoD and served as the Chief Learning Officer for the Office of Naval Intelligence in Suitland, MD. She has an extensive education and training portfolio that includes certification as a Professional in Human Resources, Joint Professional Military Education Phase II, and various master's degrees from prestigious universities such as the Dwight D. Eisenhower School for National Security and Resource Strategy, the University of Maryland, and the Maryland University of Integrative Health. Ms. Hardison is also a certified Yoga Teacher.

Ms. Hardison's outstanding military career and her dedication to serving her country have earned her numerous awards and recognitions, including the Legion of Merit, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, and Meritorious Service Medal (four awards each). She also has several campaign medals and other honors to her name.

In addition to her professional career, Ms. Hardison is an active member of her community and serves on the Board of Directors for the Valor Run, a non-profit organization dedicated to honoring the military women who have served our nation since the 9/11 terrorist attacks.

Ms. Hardison is married to Dr. R. Damion Hardison, MD, and they live in Northern Virginia. They are foodies who enjoy weightlifting and traveling the world. Ms. Hardison has two grown sons, Dr. Scott Rhodes, DPT, and 2nd Lieutenant Noah Rhodes, U.S. Army, as well as bonus children, including two daughters, Charity and Robin Hardison; one son, Ro Hardison, and one grandson, Atticus Stewart.







